Top 10 Places to Visit

We've got you covered with the best places to visit during your stay in Worcestershire!



1. Malvern Hills

An area of outstanding natural beauty, the Malvern Hills allow visitors to experience a truly iconic landscape as well as cultural heritage, wildlife and geology. A hike up to the Worcestershire Beacon must be at the top of your list!

2. Worcester Cathedral

A famous landmark in the heart of Worcester city centre. Home to the resting place of the infamous 'bad' King John and known for sealing the Magna Carta, which some historians regard as the first step towards England's constitutional monarchy.

3. Broadway

A chocolate box village on the edge of the Cotswolds. Broadway offers unique charm and class with its many independent retailers and historic museums.

4. Severn Valley Railway

One of the UK's finest heritage railways, starting from Kidderminster you will make your way through the picturesque Worcestershire countryside, heading towards your final destination of Bridgnorth.

6. West Midlands Safari Park

Home to some of the world's most beautiful and endangered animal species, West Midlands Safari Park is one of the region's most popular attractions. Explore 4 miles of Drive-through Safari, walk-through attractions and an Adventure Theme Park.

7. Morgan Experience Centre

The Morgan Motor Company welcomes over 30,000 visitors from around the world to tour the factory each year. Each one of those visitors gets within metres of the vehicles being crafted as they walk the production line. The experience of a Morgan factory tour is unparalleled within the automotive industry, with visitors being able to immerse themselves in the production process.

8. Wyre Forest

The UK's largest native woodland with acres of rich forest for visitors to enjoy. Walking routes are available for all abilities. For adventurers, climb to the top of the treetops with Go Ape!

9. Worcestershire Vineyards

Worcestershire is fast becoming a wine producing county, with tours and tasting experiences available to visitors. Astley Vineyard and Deer Park Wines have bookable tours where you can learn the craft of English wine production.

10. Waterways

Experience Worcestershire's waterways and natural beauty. The county is home to the River Severn and the River Avon. There are so many water-based activities to enjoy including paddle-boarding with Wittering SUP, canal boat hire with ABC Leisure or canoe hire from the market town of Bewdley.

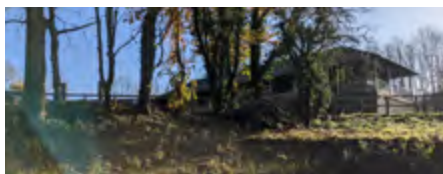

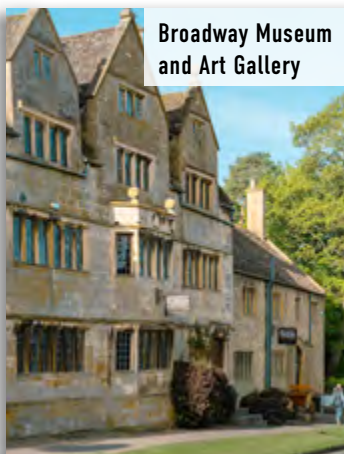

The Gloucestershire Warwickshire Railway is a volunteer operated heritage railway in Gloucestershire and Worcestershire offering a round trip of 28 miles. It uses part of the route of the former Great Western Railway's main line from Birmingham to Cheltenham which was used to run via Stratford-upon-Avon.

It now operates between Cheltenham Racecourse and Broadway commanding wonderful views of nearby sleepy hamlets and villages, with outstanding outlooks across to the Malvern Hills and beyond.
