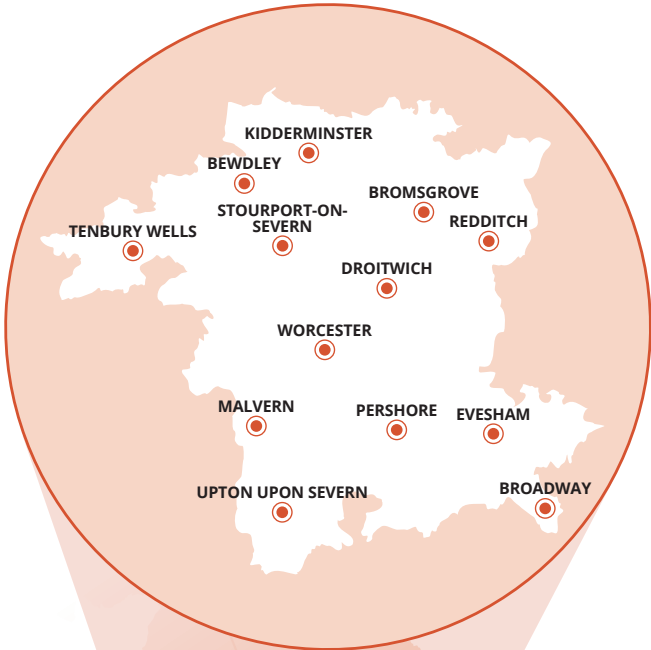

# What is Worcestershire famous for?

Worcestershire is a county nestled in the heart of England. Famous for its iconic sauce found in most cupboards across the world, mispronunciation and notably referenced as the magical kingdom in Shrek the Third (which was also mispronounced!).

**Let us offer you a deeper insight into what Worcestershire is most famous for!**

## The most picturesque cricket ground in the country

New Road has been home to Worcestershire County Cricket Club since 1896, widely rated as the world's most beautiful cricket ground. The ground is overlooked by the iconic Worcester Cathedral and hosts first-class cricket.

## The land that inspired some of our most loved stories

C.S. Lewis, writer of The Chronicles of Narnia and J.R.R. Tolkien, author of the Lord of the Rings, are two of the most renowned authors of the 20th century, who both shared a unique connection to the Malvern area. Malvern's inspiring landscapes are said to have influenced their writing, particularly Tolkien's vivid depictions of Middle-earth.

One notable feature of Malvern is its Victorian gas lamps, which are believed to have inspired Lewis when creating the iconic lamppost in The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe. These atmospheric lamps are still lighting parts of Malvern today, and add to the area's magical charm and enduring connection to their literary legacies. Infact, Great Malvern is the only town in Britain that still has gas lamps on public roads!



## Powerhouse of industry

Worcestershire's rich industrial heritage was shaped by its unique blend of innovation and geography, making it a vital hub of activity during Britain's industrial heyday.

The mighty River Severn and an extensive network of canals served as essential transport routes, fuelling industries across the county.

Droitwich became renowned for its salt production, Kidderminster for its exquisite carpets, and Redditch famously produced 90% of the world's needles during the Victorian era. These achievements showcase Worcestershire's pivotal role in shaping global trade and craftsmanship, leaving a lasting legacy that visitors can still explore today.

## Sir Edward Elgar

One of England's most famous composers was born in Lower Broadheath, Worcestershire. Sir Edward Elgar built an impressive portfolio of celebrated musical masterpieces throughout his life, including the Enigma Variations, earning both national and international acclaim for his contributions to music. Visitors can visit the National Trust site of his birthplace and take the Elgar route.

## Royal Worcester

Worcester porcelain is a world-renowned brand with over 250 years of heritage. It is believed to be one of the oldest remaining English porcelain brands. The Factory in the heart of Worcester stopped production in 2009, but this fascinating site is now a fantastic visitor attraction with exhibitions and interactive displays. You can even paint your own pot.

## Cider & hops

Due to Worcestershire's agricultural influence, the county grows a lot of hops locally. This dates back to the 1600's right through to today, where the Teme Valley especially has retained an important part of Worcestershire's hop production. The county has seen an increase in microbreweries in recent years including The Hopshed, Brew61, Teme Valley Brewery, Bewdley Brewery and Cooper Beech Brewery.

Plenty of orchards can be also seen right across the county resulting in plenty of local cider production, including Oldfields Cider and Barbourne Cider.

## Worcestershire Sauce

Arguably one of Worcestershire's biggest exports, Worcestershire Sauce has been produced at the Lea and Perrins factory on Midland Road, Worcester, since 1837. Local chemists John Wheelley Lea and William Henry Perrins created a new condiment recognised today widely around the world.

After letting it mature for 18 months, they discovered it had transformed into a flavourful sauce. Impressed by its taste, they decided to bring it to market and the rest is history. While the factory isn't open to visitors, you can still experience the story of Lea & Perrins through visits to the Worcester City Museum and other locations.

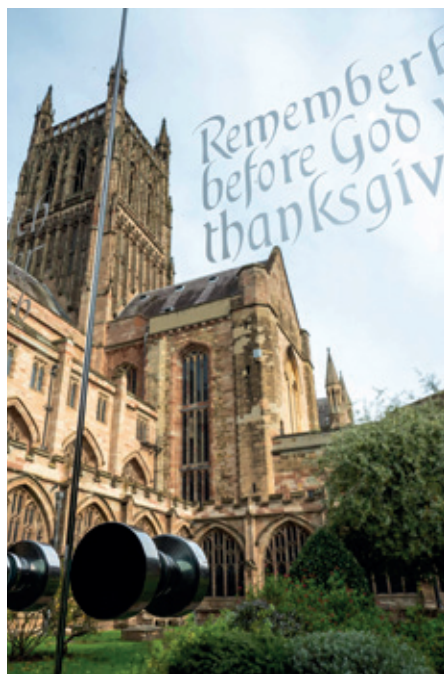

# The Big 3

Experience a piece of Worcester's history with a group visit to its three museums all based in the city centre. From tales of the English Civil War to the resting place of the infamous King John, the faithful city of Worcester is the perfect day trip destination.



## 1. Worcester Cathedral

A spectacular sight across Worcester's city skyline, the Cathedral has been a place of worship for over fourteen centuries. Welcoming visitors from across the world, Worcester Cathedral is regarded as one of the most interesting of all England's cathedrals, especially architecturally.

Your guests can be guided around the Cathedral with expert insight and knowledge on the Cathedral's history and main attractions which include the resting place of King John, and Arthur, Prince of Wales.

## 2. The Commandery

A historic building, most famous for being the Royalist Headquarters during the deciding battle of the English Civil War – the Battle of Worcester 1651.

Your group will experience life as soldiers, 300 miles from home, delegates can test their skills in battle strategy and even come face-to-face with Oliver Cromwell. The gardens are a must-visit, where you can connect with nature in the heart of the city. Be guided through the history and learn about the uses of the building from an early medieval chapel to a printworks.

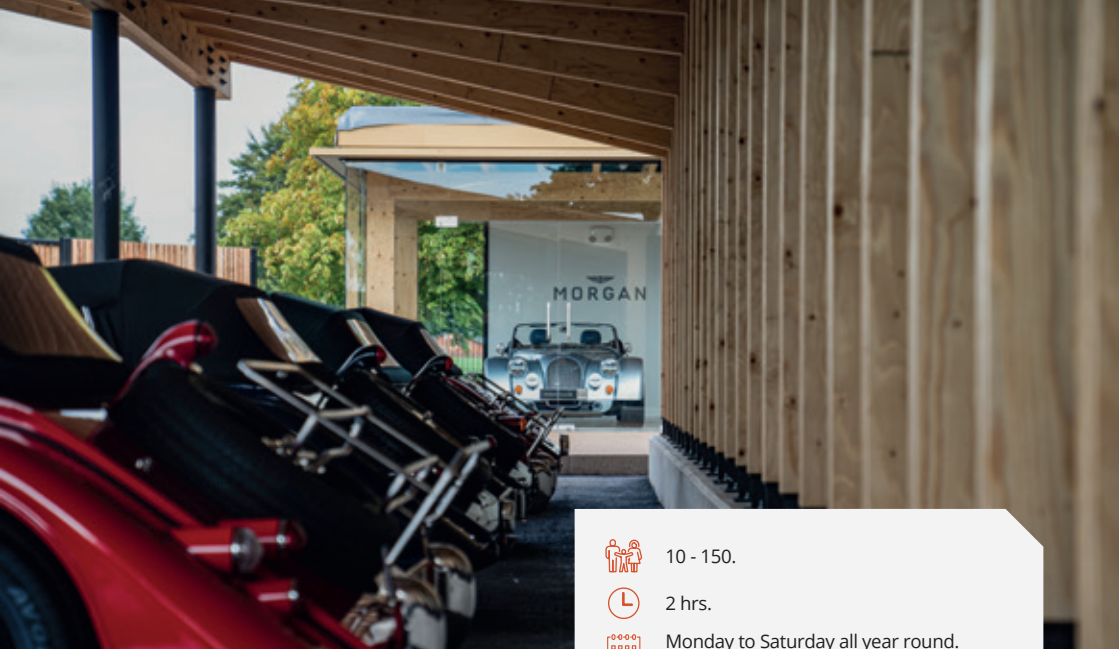

## Broadway Tower

The tower is an iconic landmark on top of the beautiful Cotswolds escarpment. It was the brainchild of the great 18th century landscape designer, "Capability Brown". His vision was carried out for George William 6th Earl of Coventry with the help of renowned architect James Wyatt and completed in 1798.

Great Malvern Priory has been welcoming all for over 900 years.
